Inspector Thompson underlined police priorities

Drugs, alcohol and street violence at the top of the list, four to five police officers on a shift Joint Director of Integrated Commissioning NHS Kernow & Cornwall Council Falmouth, outlined the issues now facing an ageing population and undiagnosed dementia in social care and bed blocking.

Flyers sent out reminding of drop in events, approximately 105 responses. Expecting the formal consultation period to start in October, currently still at pre-submission stage. Cllr proofreading text and working document. Cllrs going to Cornwall Council Design and Print tomorrow to sort out photos and maps.

The document itself; housing and green gaps, habitat and biodiversity are new sections. Steering group this Thursday.

### 115. CLIMATE AND ECOLOGICAL SITUATION -

Cllr Bennett invited the Clerk to give a summary of the resident's action group progress;

The groups have a new name 'Budock Community Action Groups'

29<sup>th</sup> August 2019 Parish Gathered to listen to presentations on, 1, Where we are with the Climate 2. What small changes can we make at home. 3. Neighbourhood Woods for community woodlands. Followed on the 16<sup>th</sup> September Parish Gathering -Discussion evening to identify ways to build community resilience for the challenges ahead regarding Food, Energy, Water, Air Quality and Biodiversity

Following on from these discussions the following focus groups have formed/forming 'Budock Community Action Groups' consist of;

- 1. 'Neighbourhood Woods' Community Woodlands
- 2. 'Budock Energy Group' Building resilience with clean energy.
- 3. 'Air Quality' Walking bus/Air quality monitor/car share
- 4. 'Community Gardens and Allotments'
- 5. 'Litter Picking' monthly supported by BPC kit and Cllrs joining in picking litter.
- 6. 'Farmers Group' looking at water harvesting Budock and Mawnan combined
- 7. 'Waste Not Want Not' tabletop sale (reuse recycle) aiming towards a repair café and chat space
- 8. 'Elders Rock' working with Age Concern to pull volunteers together, visiting the elderly/housebound etc
- 9. 'Sustainable Food' Resilience and sustainable food.

# 116. TAYLOR WIMPEY (TW) SITE MEETING 15<sup>TH</sup> AUGUST 2019 – REPORT FROM CLLR BENNETT.

Cllr Bastin and Bennett meet with Taylor Wimpey every 4-6 weeks

A parishioner had asked about entrance to site. This is an unsafe play area, needs a stone wall. TW appears to be listening and responding to concerns, although the ragwort is still growing all across the field, assurances given that it will be dealt with.

The flooding issue, they have been clearing the path but not sufficiently.

# 117. BARRATTS PRESENTATION TO BPC TREVERVA REF; 130 NEW HOMES – REPORT FROM CLLR BENNETT.

Meeting at Treverva, Cllrs met with representatives from Barratts regarding the 130 new homes across from Persimmons. The design not finalised. Near Persimmons disputed entrance, commissioning their own survey. To get the site lines it will mean removing a lot of hedging, but they will build a Cornish Hedge.

Use local material. Air Source heating won't put on solar panels. EV charging points at each house. They will try not to make any non-material amendments; they are trying to move away from those. Offered to come back and talk again in October.

## 118. SPEED VISOR UPDATE - REPORT FROM CLLR BENNETT ON THE 'EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

- Community Network Panel agreed to match fund a speed visor for Budock Village.
- Speed visor at Treverva issue with placing in the preferred spot as this would need wayleaves in someone's garden and Highways don't like this.
